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Section 1: Getting Started

This section helps you to quickly start using your device.

Understanding This User Manual

The sections of this manual generally follow the features of your device. A robust index for features begins on page 138.

Also included is important safety information, beginning on page 119, that you should know before using your device.

This manual gives navigation instructions according to the default display settings. If you select other settings, navigation steps may be different.

Unless otherwise specified, all instructions in this manual assume that you are starting from a Home screen. To get to a Home screen, you may need to unlock the device. For more information, refer to "Securing Your Device" on page 12.

Note: Instructions in this manual are based on default settings and may vary from your device depending on the software version on your device and any changes to the device's settings. Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen. All screen images in this manual are simulated. Actual displays may vary depending on the software version of your device and any changes to the device's settings.

Special Text

In this manual, some text is set apart from the rest. This special text is intended to point out important information, share quick methods for activating features, define terms, and more. The definitions for these methods are as follows:

- Note: Presents alternative options for the current feature, menu, or sub-menu.
- Tip: Provides quick or innovative methods or useful shortcuts.
- Important: Points out important information about the current feature that could affect performance.
- Warning: Brings important information to your attention that can help to prevent loss of data or functionality or damage to your device.

Text Conventions

This manual provides condensed information about how to use your device. To make this possible, the following text conventions are used to represent often-used steps:

Arrows are used to represent the sequence of selecting successive options in longer, or repetitive, procedures.

For example:


From a Home screen, touch → **©** Settings → Connections tab → Wi-Fi.



Certain features and options use an **OFF/ON** button.

For example:

Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Bluetooth



Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-lon battery. A Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) are included with the device for charging the battery.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices. Approved accessories are designed to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

Battery Indicator

The Battery icon in the Status Bar shows the battery power level. When battery power is 15% or less, your device prompts you to charge the battery. If you continue to operate the device without charging, the device powers off. For battery use information, see "About Device" on page 137.

Charging the Battery

Your device comes with a Wall/USB Charger (Charging Head and USB cable) to charge your device from any standard AC power outlet.

Note: The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time. After the first charge, you can use the device while charging.

Important! You cannot charge the battery using the USB cable and your PC.

Note: If the battery is completely discharged, allow it to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

 Insert the USB cable into the device's Charger/ Accessory Port.



2. Insert the USB cable into the Charging Head.



3. Plug the Charging Head into a standard AC power outlet.

Warning! While the device is charging, if the touch screen does not function due to an unstable power supply, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the USB cable from the device.

4. When charging is complete, unplug the Charging Head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Turning Your Device On and Off


Turning Your Device On

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.

Turning Your Device Off

- Press and hold the Power/Lock Key.
- 2. On the Device options menu, touch **Power off**
 - → 0K.



Setting Up Your Device

When you turn on your NOOK for the first time, follow the prompts to connect to a Wi-Fi network and set up your device.

- 1. At the welcome screen, touch Start.
- 2. Your NOOK displays a list of the Wi-Fi networks it detects in your area. Touch the name of a Wi-Fi network to which you want to connect. If the network displays a lock symbol, you will be prompted to enter a password to connect to the network. If you do not know the password, ask the network administrator. Once you have entered the password in the password dialog box, touch Connect.
- 3. Once your NOOK connects to the network, touch Next.
- Set the date, time, and time zone for your NOOK. Touch any of these items to display a dialog box for making changes, and then touch Next to continue.

- Read the End User License Agreement (EULA) for Software. If you agree to the EULA, touch the checkbox I understand and agree to the terms and conditions above. (If you do not agree to the EULA, you will not be able to use your NOOK.)
- The EULA screen also offers you a chance to share diagnostic data with Samsung. Touch Yes or No to indicate your decision, and then touch Next.
- Next, you'll be prompted to set up accounts on your NOOK:
 - Google account: Setting up a Google account on your device gives you access to Google Play and other Google apps. You can sign in to your existing Google account or create a new Google account, or skip this step. You can also enter information to personalize your tablet.
 - Samsung account: With an optional Samsung account, you have access to Samsung apps and services. Sign in to your existing Samsung account using the account credentials, or sign in with your Google ID. You can create a Samsung account here if you don't already have one.

- Dropbox: Your NOOK includes a 50 GB Dropbox account for two years. Dropbox can automatically save your pictures and videos to the web, so they're accessible to any devices and computers you link to your Dropbox account. Touch the button to create or sign in or, to skip this step, touch Skip.
- 8. Next, your device displays a full-screen welcome page for NOOK. (Until you have registered your set up a NOOK to a new or existing account, your NOOK will display this same welcome page whenever you launch any NOOK app such as the NOOK Library.)

Note: If the screen dims or turns off, press the _____ **Home** key to continue.

Registering Your NOOK

After you have set up your Samsung Galaxy Tab 4 NOOK[®] and registered your Google account, your device displays a full-screen welcome page for NOOK.

Until you have registered your NOOK to a new or existing account, your NOOK will display this same welcome page whenever you launch a NOOK app such as the NOOK Library. Follow the steps below to register your NOOK.

Note: You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network to register your NOOK.

Registering an Existing NOOK Account

If you already have a Barnes & Noble or NOOK account, touch Sign In.

- On the Sign In screen, enter the email address and password for your account.
- 2. Touch Sign In.

Creating a New NOOK Account

If you do not already have a Barnes & Noble or NOOK account, touch **Create Account**.

- On the screen for creating your account, enter information, and then touch Submit:
 - Your first name
 - Your last name
 - The email address you to use for your NOOK account.
 - · A password
 - · A security question
- Your NOOK displays links to legal notices, including the NOOK Device Terms of Service, the NOOK Store Terms of Service, and the NOOK Privacy Policy. To read a notice, touch its link. If you have read the legal notices and accept them, touch Accept.

Note: If you do not accept the legal terms, you will not be able to use your NOOK.

- 3. Next, you will set up a credit card for your account. You have the option of skipping this step, but you will not be able to make any purchases in the NOOK Shop until a credit card has been added to your account. Enter information about the credit card, and then touch Next:
 - The first and last name on the credit card account.
 - Touch the pop-up menu to select the card type
 - Touch pop-up menus to select the expiration date for the credit card.
- Enter the billing address for the credit card, including Street address, City, State, ZIP Code, and Country (United States or Canada).
- 5. Touch Submit.

Note: You will need to create device accounts for each user assigned a profile on your NOOK. For example, if Julie owns a NOOK and creates an adult profile for her husband Mike and a child account for her daughter Sarah, both Mike and Sarah will need user accounts on the NOOK, in addition to their NOOK profiles. For more information, see "NOOK Library" on page 52.

Memory Card

Your device supports removable microSD or microSDHC memory cards with maximum capacities of 64 GB (not included). Memory cards are used to store music, photos, videos, and other files.

Installing a Memory Card

- Open the memory card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- With the gold contacts facing down, carefully slide the memory card into the slot, pushing gently until it clicks into place.



3. Close the memory card slot cover.

Securing Your Device

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out or you can lock it manually.

 Unlock the tablet by swiping your finger across the screen. This is the default Screen lock (Swipe), and offers no security.

Prevent others from using or accessing personal data and information stored in the device by using a secure Screen Lock.

For more information about creating and enabling a secure Screen Lock, see "Lock Screen" on page 113.

Locking the Device Manually

Press the Power/Lock Key.

Unlocking the Device

- 1. Press the Power/Lock Key. The Lock screen displays.
- 2. Swipe across the screen as shown. This is the default Swipe screen lock and offers no security.



Section 2: Understanding Your Device

This section outlines key features of your device and describes the screen and the icons that appear when the device is in use. It also shows how to navigate through the device.

Features



Note: This device does not support some USB storage media devices. To find accessories for your Galaxy Tab 4, go to Go to samsung.com/us/mobile/galaxy-tabaccessories and use your model number to find compatible accessories.

Front and Sides

The following items can be found on the front and sides of your device.



- Front-Facing Camera Lens: Takes photos or records videos
- Microphone: Records audio.
- Power/Lock Key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. Press to lock the device or to wake the screen for unlocking.
- Volume Key: From a Home Screen, press to adjust master volume. During music playback, press to adjust volume.
- **5. Infrared Blaster**: Emits infrared signals used for controlling external devices.
- Memory Card Slot: Install a memory card for storage of files (not included).
- 7. Back Key: Return to the previous screen or option.
- **8. Home Key**: Display the central Home Screen.
- Recent Key: Touch and hold to display recently used apps.

Back, Top, and Bottom

The following items can be found on the back, top, and bottom of your device.



- 1. 3.5mm Headset Jack: Plug in for headphones.
- 2. Camera: Takes photos or recording videos.
- 3. Speaker: Plays music, notification tones, and audio.
- **4.** Charger/Accessory Port: Plug in a USB cable for charging or to sync music and files.

Navigating Your Device

Use command keys and the touch screen to navigate.

Command Keys

Recent Apps

To display a list of recently used apps:

■ Touch ☐ Recent apps. Touch an app to open it.

To close an app:

Drag the app preview up or down.

To end all running apps:

■ Touch **Close all**.

To manage running apps, downloads, device memory, and storage:

■ Touch Recent apps → Task Manager.

For more information, refer to "Task Manager" on page 31.

Home

To display the main Home screen:

■ Touch Home.

To launch Google Now:

■ Touch and hold Home.

Back

To return to the previous screen, option, or step:

■ Touch **Sack**.

Using the Touch Screen

Use only fingers to touch the screen.

Caution! Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.

Caution! To avoid damaging the touch screen, do not touch it with anything sharp or apply excessive pressure to it with your fingertips.

Leaving the touch screen idle for extended periods may result in afterimages (screen burn-in) or ghosting. Turn off the touch screen when you do not use the device.

Finger Gestures

Touching

To open an application, select a menu item, press an onscreen button, or enter a character using the onscreen keyboard, touch it with a finger.

Touching and Holding

Touch and hold an item for more than 2 seconds to access available options.

Dragging

To move an icon, thumbnail, or preview to a new location, touch and hold it and drag it to the target position.

Double-Tapping

Double-tap on a web page, map, or image to zoom in a part. Double-tap again to zoom out again.

Swipe


Swipe left or right on the Home screen or the Applications screen to see another panel. Swipe up or down to scroll through a web page or a list, such as contacts.

Pinching and Spreading

Spread two fingers apart on a web page, map, or image to zoom in. Pinch to zoom out.

Rotating the Screen

Many applications allow display in either portrait or landscape orientation. Rotating the device causes the display to automatically adjust to fit the new screen orientation.




To prevent the display from rotating automatically, open the Notification Panel and deselect **Screen rotation**.

Note: Some applications do not allow screen rotation. Some applications display a different screen depending on the orientation. For example, the calculator turns into a scientific calculator when rotated to landscape.

Sweeping

Sweep your hand across the screen to capture a screenshot. The image is saved in **Gallery** → Screenshots album.



Note: It may not be possible to capture a screenshot while using some applications.

Covering

Cover the screen with a palm to pause media playback.

Capturing Screenshots

Press and hold the Power/Lock Key and Home to capture and save an image of the current screen.

Note: A copy of the screenshot is automatically saved to the clipboard.

To view the screenshot:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch → My Files.
- 2. Under Categories → touch Images.
- 3. Touch a screenshot file to display it.

Multi Window

Multi task by using up to four applications at the same time.

Note: Only applications displayed on the Multi window panel can be used with the Multi window feature.

Activate Multi Window

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Device tab.
- Touch the OFF/ON button under Multi window to turn Multi window ON
- If desired, touch Multi window and then touch Open in multi window view to automatically view content in Multi window when you open files from My Files or Video player, or attachments from email.

Note: You can also activate Multi window from the Notification Panel. For more information, refer to "Notification Panel" on page 26.



Note: Once Multi window is activated, to show the Multi window panel, touch and hold Recent apps. The Multi window panel appears at the right side of the screen. To hide the Multi window panel, touch Back.

Multi Window Panel

Multi window apps are displayed on the Multi window panel.

Display the Multi window panel:

- Activate Multi window (see "Activate Multi Window" on page 20).
- Swipe the right edge of the screen toward the center to display the Multi window panel. After a few seconds, the panel will be hidden again.


Using Multi Window Applications


You can use Multi window to run two applications at the same time.


- With Multi window activated, swipe the right edge of the screen toward the center to display the Multi window panel.
- Drag an app off the panel and release. Drag up to three more apps off of the panel and release them into one of the highlighted windows.


Window Controls

Select an application window and touch on the middle of the windows. Window controls appear:









Panel Configuration

You can rearrange the apps on the Multi window panel, add new apps, or remove apps.

On the Multi window panel:

- **1.** Touch **to** access the panel controls.
- 2. Touch Fdit.

Configuring Apps

To remove an app from the panel:

Touch and drag it off of the panel and place it in the storage area.

To add an app to the panel:

Touch and drag it from the storage area to the panel.

To relocate an app:

Touch and drag it to a new location.

To save your changes:

■ Touch Done.

Home Screen

The main Home screen is the starting point for many applications and functions and it contains items like application icons, shortcuts, folders, or Google widgets, which gives you instant access to information and applications. This is the default page and accessible from any menu by pressing — Home.

Note: Unless stated otherwise, instructions in this user manual start with the device unlocked, at the Home screen.



Extended Home Screen

The Home screen consists of the Home panel plus additional panels that extend beyond the display width to provide more space for adding shortcuts and widgets.

Slide your finger horizontally across the screen to scroll to the left or right side panels. As you scroll, the indicator at the bottom of the display shows your current position.

Customizing the Home Screens

To customize the Home screens to suit your preferences:

- 1. Navigate to one of the Home screen panels.
- Touch and hold on the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays.
- Touch Set wallpaper to change the Home screen wallpaper. For more information, refer to "Wallpapers" on page 29.
- 4. Under Add to home screen touch:
 - Apps and widgets to add app or widget shortcuts on the Home screen.
 - **Folder** to add a folder on a Home screen. For more information, refer to "Folders" on page 29.
 - Page to add a Home screen.

Display Settings

You can customize display screen settings to your preferences. For more information, refer to "Display" on page 112.

Adding and Removing Home Screen Panels

Your device comes with seven Home screen panels. You can customize the Home screen by removing or adding panels.


Note: The default Home screen displays when you touch **Home**.

 From a Home screen, pinch the screen from the left and right side to the center to display the editing screen.

Tip: Touch and hold on the screen until the **Home screen** pop-up displays. Under **Add to Home screen**, touch **Page** to add a Home screen.

Use these controls to configure panels:

- Remove: Touch and drag a panel to the Trash Can to remove the panel from the Home screen.
- Default Home Page: Touch the Home icon on a panel to set it as the default home screen.
- Add: Touch to add a new panel, up to a total of seven. This option is available when less than seven panels have been added.



To rearrange the order of panels:

Touch and drag a panel to a new location.

To return to the Home screen:

Touch Back.

Google Search Bar

The Google Search Bar provides an on-screen Internet search engine powered by Google.

- From the main Home screen, swipe the screen to the left to bring up the next Home screen.
- 2. Touch the Google Search bar Google .
- 3. Use the on-screen keyboard to enter the item you want to search for, then touch Q.
- **4.** Touch \P to use Google Voice Search. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Notifications

Notification icons appear on the Status Bar at the top of the screen to report new messages, calendar events, device status, and more. For details about these notifications, open the Notification Panel.

Notification Panel

To view the Notification Panel:

- On the Home screen, touch and hold the Status Bar and then drag downward to display the Notification Panel.
- Scroll down the list to see additional notification details.
- 3. Touch an item to view or open it.
- To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right. Touch X to clear all notifications.

To close the Notification Panel:

Swipe upward from the bottom of the screen or touch
 Back.

Accessing Additional Panel Functions

In addition to notifications, the Notification Panel also provides quick and ready access to separate device functions. These can be quickly activated or deactivated by toggling them on or off. You can also select which functions are displayed.

- 1. To go to Settings, touch Settings. For more information, refer to "Settings" on page 104.
- 2. Touch to display additional quick settings buttons.
 - Touch to configure the Notification panel. For more information, refer to "Notification Panel" on page 116.
 - Touch to display your primary quick settings buttons and notifications.
- To set the display brightness, touch the Brightness slider and drag it to set the brightness. For more information, refer to "Display" on page 112.
- 4. To adjust the system volume, touch the Sound slider and drag it to set the Notification sound level or touch to set the level for Notifications, Media, and System sounds. For more information, refer to "Sound" on page 110.

Status Bar

The Status Bar at the top of the home screen provides device information (such as network status, signal strength, battery charge, and time) on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

To display the Status Bar:

From a Home screen, swipe downward from the top of the screen. The grey Status Bar will appear. It will disappear after a few seconds.

Shortcuts and Widgets

You can add, reposition, or remove shortcuts and widgets from the Home screen.

- Shortcuts: Icons on the Home screen that launch applications.
- Widgets: Small applications that run on the Home screen.

Adding a Shortcut or Widget

You can customize the Home screen by adding shortcuts and widgets.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays. Touch Apps and Widgets.
 - or -
 - Touch to display the Apps screen.
- For shortcuts, touch the Apps tab. For widgets, touch the Widgets tab.
- Touch and hold the shortcut or widget, and then drag it to the Home screen and release.

Removing a Shortcut or Widget

Shortcuts and widgets can be removed from the Home screen.

Touch and hold the shortcut or widget until it detaches, and then drag it to Remove and release.

Note: Removing a shortcut does not delete the application; it simply removes the shortcut from the Home screen.

Folders

Place folders on the Home screen to organize items.

Adding Folders

- From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area of the screen until the Home screen pop-up appears.
- 2. Touch Folder.
- 3. Enter a name for the folder and touch OK.

Using Folders

- Touch the folder to open it and access the shortcuts inside.
- To add shortcuts to the folder, touch and hold the shortcut, and then drag it to the folder and release.
- To delete a folder, touch and hold the folder until it detaches, and then drag it to Remove and release.

Note: All shortcuts contained in the folder will also be deleted.

Wallpapers

You can choose a picture to display on the Home Screen, Lock screen, or on both the Home and Lock screens. Choose from preloaded wallpapers, or select a photo you have downloaded or taken with the Camera.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold on an empty area
 of the screen until the Home screen pop-up displays.
- 2. Touch Home Screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens for options:
 - Gallery: Access the Gallery to select a photo.
 - Live wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded interactive animated wallpapers (Home screen only).
 - Photos: Access Google Photos to select a photo (Home screen only).
 - Wallpapers: Choose from pre-loaded wallpaper images.

Note: You can also set the wallpaper in Settings. From a Home screen, touch ♣ ♣ ♣ ♠ Settings → Device tab → Wallpaper.

Apps Screen

The **Apps** screen displays all applications installed on your tablet. Applications that you download and install from Google Play or from the web are also added to a Home screen.

For more information, refer to "Applications" on page 90.

To arrange the Apps icons in alphabetical order:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Menu → View type.
- 3. Touch Alphabetical grid.

To manually change the order of the icons on the Apps screen:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch
- Touch Menu → Edit.
- 3. Touch and hold an icon and drag it to a new position.
- 4. Touch Save to save the changes.

You can place shortcuts to applications on the Home screen for quick access to the application. For more information, refer to "Adding a Shortcut or Widget" on page 28.

To view your downloaded applications:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch
- Touch <u>Pownload</u> to view downloaded apps.
- 3. Touch an icon on the **Downloaded applications** screen to launch the application.
 - or -

Add an App Shortcut to a Home screen by dragging the App icon onto the Home screen. For more information, refer to "Adding a Shortcut or Widget" on page 28.

Application Information

To view information about an App, such as the amount of storage it uses, force the App to stop, uninstall updates, and clear data:

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Application manager.
- Touch the All tab, scroll through the apps list, and touch the app to open a screen with details about the App.

Task Manager

Your device can run applications simultaneously and some applications run in the background.

Use Task Manager to see which applications are running on your device and to end running applications to extend battery life. You can also uninstall applications from your device and see how much memory is used by applications.

To access the Task Manager:

- Touch Recent apps → Task manager.
- 2. Touch each tab for options:
- Active applications: View applications running on your device. Touch End to terminate an application or End all to terminate all running applications.
- Downloaded: View applications installed from Google Play. Touch Uninstall to remove an application from your device.
- RAM manager: Display the amount of Random Access Memory (RAM) currently in use. Touch Clear memory to clear inactive and background processes.
- Storage: View internal (System storage) and external (SD card) storage memory statistics.

Screen Capture

Touch and hold the Power/Lock Key and Home to capture and save an image of the current screen.

Note: A copy of the screenshot is automatically saved to the clipboard.

To view the screen shots:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch → From a Home screen, touch
- 2. Touch to open the Screenshots album.
- 3. Touch a screen capture to view it.

Entering Text

Use the Samsung keyboard or the voice input feature to enter text.

Note: Text entry is not supported in some languages. To enter text, you must change the input language to one of the supported languages.

Using the Keyboard

To choose a text input method while entering text:

- 1. Touch any text field.
- Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.The Notification Panel screen displays.
- Touch Select input method, and then select the type of keyboard to use.

Entering Uppercase

Touch fi before entering a character. For all caps, touch it twice.

Changing the Keyboard Type

Touch and hold *** Options, and then touch it to change the keyboard type. Options are: Normal, Floating, and Split.

Changing Language Keyboards

Add languages to the keyboard, and then slide the space key left or right to change language keyboards.

Handwriting

Touch and hold **☆ Options** → **T** Handwriting, and then write a word with a finger. As you write, suggestions are offered in the word options area in case the correct letters were not recognized. Select a suggested word.



Use handwriting gestures to perform actions, such as editing or deleting characters and inserting spaces. To view the gesture guides, touch and hold ***** Options**, and then touch ***** Settings** → Help → Keyboard → Using handwriting gestures.

Entering Text By Voice

Activate the voice input feature and then speak into the microphone. The device displays what you speak.

If the device does not recognize your words, touch the underlined text and select an alternative word or phrase from the drop-down list.

To change the language or add languages for voice recognition, touch the current language.

Copying and Pasting

Touch and hold over text, drag or to select more or less text, and then touch **Copy** to copy or **Cut** to cut. The selected text is copied to the clipboard.

To paste it into a text entry field, touch and hold at the point where it should be inserted, and then touch **Paste**.

Section 3: Accounts and Contacts

This section explains how to manage accounts and contacts.

Accounts

Your device can synchronize with a variety of accounts. With synchronization, information on your device is updated with any information that changes in your accounts.

- Samsung Account: Add your Samsung Account.
- Dropbox: Add your Dropbox Account.
- Email: Add an Email Account to sync Contacts.
- Google: Add your Google Account to sync your Contacts, Calendar, and Gmail.
- LDAP: Add an LDAP Account to find entries in an LDAP directory.
- Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync: Add your Exchange Account to sync Contacts, Calendar, and Email.
- Facebook: Add a Facebook Account to sync apps.
- Twitter: Add a Twitter Account.

Setting Up Accounts

Set up and manage your synchronized accounts with the **Accounts** setting.

- 2. Touch the account type.
- Follow the prompts to enter your account credentials to complete the set up process.

Your tablet communicates with the appropriate account servers to set up your account. When complete, your account displays in the **Accounts** area of the Settings screen.

Your Google Account

In order to utilize your device to the fullest extent, you will need to create a Google Account when you first use your device. With a Google Account, Google applications will always be in sync between your tablet and computer.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings →
 General tab → Accounts → Add account → Google.
- Follow the prompts to sign into your existing account or create a new account

Your Samsung Account

Create a Samsung Account for access to Samsung apps and services, and much more.

- From a Home screen, touch → ⑥ Settings →
 General tab → Accounts → Add account →
 Samsung account.
- Follow the prompts to sign into your existing account or create a new account.

Contacts

Store contact information for your friends, family, and colleagues to quickly access information or to send a message.

To access Contacts:

■ From a Home screen, touch → L Contacts.

Add a Contact

- Touch Contacts → + Create. The Save contact
 to pop-up displays.
- To choose where the contact is stored, touch Phone or an account.
 - or -

Touch **Add new account** to add a different account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up Accounts" on page 34.

- Touch each field to enter information. Touch to add another entry, or to remove an entry. Touch to choose a label.
 - **Picture**: Touch the picture icon to assign a picture to the new contact.

- **Name**: Enter the name. Touch \checkmark to display additional name fields.
- Phone: Enter a phone number.
- Email: Enter an email address.
- **Groups**: Assign the contact to a group.
- Add another field: Add additional fields for the contact.
- 4. Touch Save.

Note: Your personal Contact entry is always listed at the top of the Contacts list under ME. Touch **Set up profile** to add your contact information.

- 1. Touch ! Contacts.
- Touch a contact in the Contacts list to view its information.
- 3. Touch Fdit.
- **4.** Touch any field to edit. For more information, refer to "Add a Contact" on page 35.

Deleting Contacts

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- 3. Touch in Delete.
- 4. At the prompt, touch OK.

Contacts Display Options

There are various ways to display your contacts.

- 1. Touch 🔼 Contacts.
- 2. Touch the **Groups** tab, **Favorites** tab, or **Contacts** tab to view contacts in various ways:
 - **Groups**: Display contacts sorted into groups—such as Not assigned, Co-workers, Family, Friends, etc. The number of contacts in each group is displayed next to the group name. Touch a group name to show only contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Create a New Group" on page 39.
 - Favorites: Show only your favorite (or starred), contacts. For more information, refer to "Favorites" on page 41.

- Contacts: Show all your contacts. Touch the Search field and enter a keyword to list contacts that contain that keyword.
- 3. While viewing **Groups**, **Favorites**, or **Contacts**, touch **Menu** for options.
- While viewing the Contacts tab, touch Menu → Settings for Contact settings.

Linked Contacts

Your device can synchronize with multiple accounts, including Google, Corporate Exchange, and other email providers. When you synchronize contacts from these accounts with your device, you may have multiple contacts for the same person.

Linking, or joining, imported contact records allows you to see all of a contact's numbers and addresses together in a single contact entry. Linking also helps you keep your contacts updated, because any changes that your contacts make to their information in the respective accounts are automatically updated the next time you synchronize with that account.

Linking Contacts

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
 - Touch

 Menu → Link contact.
- Touch the contact you want to link. The linked contact's information is displayed with the original contact's information.
- 5. Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to link other contacts.

Separating Contacts

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- Touch Menu → Separate contact. A list of linked contacts is displayed.
- Touch to separate a linked contact.

My Personal Contact

Your own personal Contact entry is listed under ME at the top of the Contacts list. You can send your personal Contact entry as a vCard via Bluetooth or as a message attachment.

Creating Your Personal Contact Entry

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch Set up profile, then enter your information in the Contact fields. For more information, see "Add a Contact" on page 35.

Sharing Your Personal Contact Entry

You can send your personal Contact entry as a vCard via Bluetooth to other Bluetooth devices, or as a message attachment.

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch your personal Contact entry to display your Contact information.
- 3. Touch Menu → Share namecard via.
- Choose a sending method, then follow the prompts to send the profile.

Sharing Contact Information

You can send a contact's information using Bluetooth to other Bluetooth devices, or in an Email or Gmail as an attachment.

Note: Not all Bluetooth devices accept contacts and not all devices support transfers of multiple contacts. Check the target device's documentation.

- Touch Contacts.
- 2. Touch Menu → Share namecard via.
- Touch Selected contact to share only the displayed contact, or touch Multiple contacts.
- 4. Touch a sending method, such as Bluetooth or email.
- **5.** Follow the prompts to send the contact information.

Importing and Exporting Contacts

To back up and restore your contacts, you can export your contacts list to a storage device (such as a PC), or import your contacts list from a storage device.

- Use the USB cable to connect your device to the storage device.
- 2. Touch Contacts.
- 3. Touch \blacksquare Menu \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Import/Export.
- **4.** Touch an option and then follow the prompts.

Groups

Assign contacts to Groups to make searching for contacts faster or to quickly send messages to group members.

Create a New Group

Create a new group when you add or edit a contact.

- 1. Touch **Contacts** → **Groups** tab.
- 2. Touch + Create.
- 3. Touch the **Group name** field and enter a name.
- Touch Add member, touch individual contacts or touch Select all, and then touch Done to add the selected contacts to the group.
- 5. Touch Save.

Tip: Contacts can belong to more than one group. While editing a contact, touch the Groups field to add additional groups.

Once you create a new group, the Contacts list can be set to display only the contacts in that group. For more information, refer to "Contacts Display Options" on page 36.

Adding Group Members

To add a contact to a group, just edit a contact's Group field.

To add multiple contacts to a group:

- 1. Touch Contacts → Groups tab.
- 2. Touch the group to which you want to add members.
- Touch Menu → Add member.
 The contacts that can be added display.
- 4. Touch Select all or the name of each contact to add.
- **5.** Touch **Done** to add the contacts to the group.

Removing Group Members

- 1. Touch 【 Contacts → Groups tab.
- Touch the group from which you want to remove members.
- 3. Touch Menu → Remove member.
- Touch Select all or the name of each contact to remove.
- Touch Done to remove the contacts.Contacts are removed from the group and the group name is removed from each contact's Group field.

Renaming a Group

- 1. Touch **Contacts** → **Groups** tab.
- **2.** Touch the group you want to rename.
- 3. Touch Menu → Edit group.
- **4.** Touch the **Group name** field and enter a new name.
- Touch Save.

Deleting Groups

- Touch Contacts → Groups tab → Menu → Delete groups.
- Touch individual groups or touch Select all, then touch Done.
- Touch Group only to delete only the group or Group and group members to delete both the group and the group's members.

Favorites

Mark contact records with a \bigstar gold star to identify them as favorites.

Mark a Contact as a Favorite

- 1. Touch ! Contacts.
- 2. Touch a contact in the Contacts list to display it.
- 3. Touch the **\sqrt Star** so that it turns gold **\sqrt**.

Tip: You do not have to edit the contact to mark it as a favorite.

View Favorites

- 1. Touch Contacts.
- Touch the Favorites tab. Only your starred contacts are displayed.
 - or -

Touch the **Groups** tab, then touch **Starred in Android** to list only your starred contacts that are being saved to your Google Account.

Remove Favorites

- 1. Touch **Contacts** → **Favorites** tab.
- Touch Menu → Remove from Favorites.
- Touch individual contacts or touch Select all, then touch Done to remove.

Note: To remove the currently displayed contact from your favorites list, touch the ★ Star next to the contact's name so that it is no longer gold ★.

Section 4: NOOK

NOOK Features on the Home Screen

The Home screen features widgets and app shortcuts that provide quick and easy access to your NOOK Library and to NOOK content.

NOOK Library Widget

This widget displays books and periodicals from your Library. A scrollable carousel presents the items you have most recently purchased or accessed.

- To open a book or periodical, touch its cover.
- To scroll through the carousel, touch the arrows at either side of the carousel.
- To open your Library, touch IN .

NOOK Shop Widget

The NOOK Shop widget presents new recommendations and special offers from the NOOK Store.

App Shortcuts

The Home screen features shortcuts to these apps:

- NOOK Shop: Opens the NOOK Store where you can shop for books, periodicals, and apps.
- NOOK Search: Lets you search the NOOK Store and your Library for keywords.
- NOOK Today: Presents new recommendations and promotions from the NOOK Store.

Open Book Icon

The open-book icon in the lower left-hand corner of the Home screen provides a shortcut to the book or periodical you have been reading most recently.

NOOK Today

The NOOK Today app presents recommendations and special offers from the NOOK Store. Touch the app shortcut to open it. By default, the NOOK Today app shortcut appears on the Home screen.

NOOK Apps

NOOK Apps include popular apps such as Angry Birds, Hulu Plus, and Pandora, designed specifically for your NOOK. .

If you have not yet purchased any NOOK apps, NOOK Apps displays a shortcut to the Apps section of the NOOK Store.

NOOK Reader

Opening a Book or Periodical

To open a book or periodical in the Library or the Library widget, touch its cover.

Turning Pages

- To turn to the next page, touch the right side of the screen. Or swipe from the right side of the screen.
- To turn back to the previous page, touch the left side of the screen. Or swipe from the left side of the screen.

Placing a Bookmark

Touch the upper right hand corner of the screen to bring up the bookmark ribbon, and then tap the bookmark ribbon to add a bookmark.

Viewing a List of Bookmarks

- 1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch limit to open the Contents window.

- 2. Touch the Bookmarks tab.
- 3. To move to a bookmarked page, touch the page in the list of bookmarked pages.

Displaying the Table of Contents

- 1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch to open the Contents window.
- To move to a chapter or section, touch its name in the Contents.

Changing Type Size, Font, Margins, and Other Page Elements

- **1.** Touch the center of the page, and then touch open the Text Options window.
- Select the type size, font, margins, line spacing, and color theme you want. If the publisher has recommended a page design, you can switch to it by toggling the Publisher Defaults on.

Searching a Book

- 1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch open the options menu.
- 2. Touch Find in Book.
- Type the word or phrase you want to find, and then touch the Search button (a magnifying glass).
- Touch the right arrow or left arrow to find the next or previous appearance of the word or phrase.

Viewing the Details Page

- 1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch open the options menu.
- 2. Touch View Details.

Configuring Reader Settings

- 1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch open the options menu.
- 2. Touch **Settings** to configure the Reader:
 - · Choose a Page Turn Effect.
 - Enable or disable 2-page layouts of PDFs.
 - . Show or hide the Status Bar in books.
 - Download and select other free dictionaries. (Only one dictionary may be active at a time.)

Using Social Features in a Book

1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch do open the Share menu.

- 2. Touch any of the following:
 - Recommend
 - Post Reading Status
 - · Rate and Review
 - Like on Facebook

Lending a Book to a Contact

Many books can be lent through the NOOK LendMe program. If a book is lendable, you may lend it once. The friend you lend it to has up to 7 days to accept or decline your offer. Once the offer is accepted, your friend has up to 14 days to read the book. While the book is on loan, it is not available to you for reading. After the 14 days, the book is automatically returned to you and becomes available for you to read.

- 1. Touch the center of the page, and then touch open the options menu.
- Touch View Details. If the book can be lent, it will display a LendMe button.
- Touch LendMe, and then select the contact to whom you would like to lend the book.

Displaying the Status Bar in Books

By default, your NOOK does not display the black Status Bar with the battery and Wi-Fi icons, the clock, and other notifications when you are reading a book.

To display the Status Bar in books:

- 1. Open the NOOK Settings app, and then touch **Books**.
- **2.** Touch **Show status bar**, making sure that the checkbox is selected.

Changing the Page Turn Effect

Your NOOK offers a choice of three animated effects when you turn a page in a NOOK Book or other EPUB-formatted ebook or magazine. The page can curl as though you were turning a paper page, one page can slide smoothly to the other, or there can be no special effect at all as the one page simply flashes to the next.

To select the Page Turn Effect you want for Books:

- 1. Open the NOOK Settings app, and then touch **Books**.
- Touch the Page Curl Effect you want, from Curl, Slide, or None.

Note: To change this setting for Magazines, open the Magazines screen in NOOK Settings and select the effect you want: Curl or Slide.

Displaying Two-page Spreads in PDFs in Landscape Format

By default, your NOOK displays PDFs as a two-page spreads when you hold your NOOK in landscape mode. A two-page spread means you see two pages at a time as though you were holding a book.

To turn this feature on or off:

- 1. Open the NOOK Settings app, and then touch **Books**.
- Touch the Enable 2-page layout in landscape control to turn it on or off.

Reading Newspapers and Magazines

Newspapers and magazines use many of the same reading features as books.

Page View and Article View

Some magazines and newspapers present two ways of viewing content.

- Page View presents an onscreen replica of the printed page.
- Article View displays the text of an article in an easy-toread, scrollable format. You can scroll up and down to read the article. Swipe right and left to move from one article to another.

In publications that support these features, a button at the bottom of the screen lets you toggle between Page View and Article View.

In publications that do not support Page View and Article View, use the navigation tools and gestures you use in books to move from page to page and section to section.

Additional Features in Article View

In Article View, touch the center of the page to open Reading Tools at the top of the Screen.

- Touch Aa to open controls for formatting the page.
- Touch the grid icon (9 small square) to display all pages as thumbnail images in a scrollable grid. To jump to a page in the grid, touch it.
- Touch to see a scrollable table of contents for the publication.

Catalogs

Your NOOK supports catalogs with interactive hotspots. Touching one of these hotspots opens a browser that takes you to a Web page about an item or topic in the catalog. By default, hotspots are turned on.

To turn hotspots for catalogs on or off:

- Open the NOOK Settings app, and then touch Magazines.
- Touch Enable HotSpots to turn hotspots on or off.

Comics

Your NOOK supports comics. Zoom View Letterboxing is a feature that lets you move from frame to frame, even if the frames are different sizes.

To turn on Zoom View Letterboxing:

- Open the NOOK Settings app, and then touch Magazines.
- 2. Touch the Enable Zoom View Letterboxing checkbox in Comics.

Opening DRM-protected Files

DRM stands for Digital Rights Management. DRM software protects books from being copied, sold, or distributed in an unauthorized manner.

Your NOOK and the Barnes & Noble website automatically make sure that when you buy and download a NOOK Book, the NOOK Book recognizes you as its legitimate owner and presents its contents for you to read on your NOOK.

In some rare cases, you might need to unlock a book or periodical that you have bought from Barnes & Noble. In this case, you'll need to enter the following information to unlock the book or periodical:

- Your name as it appears on the billing address of your NOOK or BN.com account
- The credit card number associated with your NOOK or BN.com account when you downloaded the book or periodical from your NOOK Library on your NOOK.

NOOK Shop and the NOOK Store®

To reach the NOOK Store, launch the NOOK Shop app or touch the shopping bag icon at the top of the screen in any other NOOK app.

Buying a Book in the Shop

- 1. Touch a book's cover to display its Details page.
- 2. Touch the Buy button, and then touch Confirm.

Buying a Single Issue of a Magazine or Newspaper

- **1.** Touch the cover of the magazine or newspaper.
- 2. Touch Buy Current Issue → Confirm.

Subscribing to a Magazine or Newspaper

- **1.** Touch the cover of the magazine or newspaper.
- 2. Touch Free Trial.
- If the periodical offers a choice of annual or monthly subscriptions, touch the type of subscript you want.
- 4. Touch Start My Free Trial.

Buying or Renting a Movie

Renting give you 30 days to start watching. Once you begin watching, you have 24 hours to finish.

- 1. Touch the cover of the movie.
- Touch Buy or Rent. If the movie is available in SD and HD formats, select the format you want. A dialog box opens.
- Confirm that you want to complete the purchase or rental.

Buying a TV Show

You can buy either an entire season of a TV show or individual episodes.

Touch the TV show you want to buy. To see a list of individual episodes, scroll down the Details page.

Viewing Your Wishlist

- 1. In the Shop, touch :
- 2. Touch Wishlist.

Adding a Shop Item to Your Wishlist

- 1. View the Details page for the item.
- **2.** Touch the heart icon at the top of the screen.

Managing Credit Cards

You can also manage your credit card on NOOK.com.

- . In the Shop, touch :
- 2. Touch Settings → Manage credit card → Change.
- 3. Enter the credit card details, and then touch Next:
 - Enter the first name and last name of the account holder.
 - Select the card type.
 - Select the expiration month and year.
- Enter the billing address.
- Touch Submit.

Managing Gift Cards

You can apply a gift card to purchases on your NOOK. A card number and a 4-digit PIN appear on the back of gift cards.

Once the gift card is used up, new purchases will be charged to the default credit card associated with the primary profile.

- 1. In the Shop, touch :
- Touch Settings → Manage gift card → Add Gift Card.
- 3. Enter the gift card details:
 - Touch the Card or Certificate Number field and enter the number for the gift card.
 - Touch the PIN field and enter the 4-digit PIN for the card.
- 4. Touch Submit.

Redeeming Access Codes

An access code is a 13-digit code that is available on a receipt or a card you received in a store or in the body of an email confirmation message.

To redeem an access code for a NOOK Book:

- 1. In the Shop, touch :
- 2. Touch Settings → Redeem access code.
- Touch the Enter Access Code field and type the 13digit number.
- 4. Touch Add Now.

Clearing Recent Shop Searches

- 1. In the Shop, touch .
- Touch Settings → Clear shop searches.
- 3. Touch OK.

Clearing Recent Browsing History

- 1. In the Shop, touch :
- 2. Touch Settings → Clear browsing history.
- 3. Touch OK.

NOOK Library

In NOOK Library®, see all your books, periodicals, TV shows and movies, and catalogs.

Touch an item's cover to open it.

Using Social Media Features with Library Items

To post content to Facebook or Twitter, you must first link your NOOK to your Facebook or Twitter Account. Use the NOOK Settings app to do this.

- 1. Touch and hold on the item's cover.
- 2. Touch **Share**, and then choose a social media action:
 - Recommend: Send a recommendation for the item to selected contacts, your Facebook wall, or Twitter.
 - Rate and Review: Rate the item and post comments on NOOK.com. In addition, you can choose to post the review on Facebook or Twitter.
 - **Like on Facebook**: Use your Facebook account to indicate that you like the item.

Adding a Shortcut to an Item to the Home Screen

- 1. Touch and hold on the item's cover.
- Touch Add to Home.

Organizing Library Items in Shelves

You can create shelves to organize Library content as you wish. Items added to shelves remain visible in the main areas of the Library.

Creating a Shelf

- 1. On the home screen of the Library, touch
- Touch Create New Shelf, and then enter a name for the shelf and touch Save.
- Select the items you want to include in the shelf. Touch the names of content categories like Books to see a list of all the items in that category. Touch the checkbox next to an item to add it to the Shelf.
- 4. Touch Save.

Adding or Removing Content in a Shelf

- 1. Open the shelf, and then touch :
- Touch Manage Content in Shelf, and then select or deselect items for the shelf.
- 3. Touch Save.

Renaming a Shelf

- 1. Open the shelf, and then touch .
- Touch Rename shelf, and then enter a new name for the shelf.
- 3. Touch Rename.

Removing a Shelf

Removing a shelf does not delete any of the items on the shelf. They remain available in the Library.

- 1. Open the shelf, and then touch
- Touch Remove shelf, and then touch Remove to confirm the removal.

Viewing Content in Your NOOK Archive

You can archive books and periodicals in the NOOK Cloud.

- 1. In the Library, touch .
- Touch View Archive.
 - To download an item, touch its cover.
 - To return to the Library, touch the left arrow in the top left-hand corner of the screen.

Refreshing the Content in Your Library

■ Touch , and then touch **Refresh**.

Removing an Item from Your Device

You can remove an item such as a book from your device. An image of the item remains in your Library, so that you can download it again later if you like.

In the Library, touch and hold on the item's cover, and then touch Remove from Device.

Deleting an Item from Your Account

You can permanently delete an item from your account so that it appears on none of your NOOK devices or apps and is never available to your account without being repurchased.

- 1. In the Library, touch and hold on the item's cover.
- Touch Delete from Account, and then touch Delete from Account to confirm the deletion.

NOOK Video

NOOK VideoTM is a streaming and download service that allows you to rent movies and purchase movies and TV shows for viewing on your NOOK. NOOK Video offers a wide variety of popular movies and TV shows.

NOOK Video supports both streaming and downloading content. When you purchase or rent a movie, you need to select how you will access it: streaming or downloading. Unlike books and periodicals, videos do not download automatically when purchased.

Streaming means that the content is delivered over an active Wi-Fi connection. You must be connected to a Wi-Fi Internet connection to watch streamed content. Streaming videos does not require any storage on your NOOK.

Note: When streaming content, it's best to have to a strong Wi-Fi connection.

Downloading means that you transfer the NOOK Video content over a Wi-Fi connection to your NOOK just as you download other content like books and magazines. Once you have downloaded a NOOK Video, you can watch it any time regardless of whether or not your NOOK is connected to Wi-Fi

(though rented content must be watched within the rental period, as described below). Unlike streamed videos, downloaded videos do consume storage on your NOOK. If you plan to download many videos, you should consider purchasing an optional microSD card (not included) to give your NOOK extra storage.

Note: Downloading videos may take some time. The speed of the download will depend on the length of the video and the bandwidth of your Wi-Fi network. If you are planning to download a movie to watch it offline (for example, in a location without a Wi-Fi network, such as in a car or on a plane), we recommend that you connect your NOOK to a power source and begin downloading the movie as soon as you have purchased or rented it.

Renting Movies

You can rent movies on your NOOK.

- Once you rent an item, you have 30 days to begin watching it.
- Once you start watching it, you have 24 hours to finish watching it before the rental expires. You can watch the item as many times as you like within that 24-hour period.
- You can stream an item to begin watching it right away, or you can download an item to begin watching it within the 30-day rental period.

Note: You may download a rented movie to only one device during the rental period, so be sure to download only on the device on which you intend to watch the movie. In contrast, you may stream movies on all authorized NOOK devices during the rental period. You may authorize up to five devices through your NOOK account.

Closed Captioning

Your NOOK supports closed captioning on select NOOK Video titles.

Note: Not all titles include Closed Captioning data.

UltraViolet

UltraViolet TM is an all-new way to collect, access, and enjoy your movies and TV shows in the cloud.

- Purchase a Blu-ray, DVD, or digital video with the UltraViolet logo, and you can stream or download your movie or TV show to your UltraViolet-compatible devices, including your NOOK.
- Visit <u>www.uvvu.com</u> to set-up an UltraViolet account, and link your UltraViolet account to your NOOK account from your NOOK.
- To link your accounts, open the NOOK Settings app and touch NOOK Video. On the NOOK Video page, touch UltraViolet account and follow the instructions.

- To add a DVD or Blu-ray to your digital collection, simply follow the instructions inside the packaging. If your UltraViolet account is linked on your NOOK, digital purchases will be automatically added to your UltraViolet collection, free with purchase.
- Instantly stream or download UltraViolet movies and TV shows

Managing NOOK Video on Your Devices

NOOK Video allows you to access NOOK Video content on up to five devices at a time. You can select which of your NOOK devices has access to NOOK video.

To select which of your NOOK devices has access to NOOK Video:

- 1. Open the NOOK Settings app.
- Touch Manage NOOK Video on Your Devices. The screen lists the NOOK devices associated with your account and authorized to access NOOK.
- To remove a device from the list, touch its name. A dialog box opens, asking you to confirm that you want to de-authorize the device.
- Touch Confirm.

NOOK Profiles

A NOOK Profile[™] tailors content and shopping experiences on your NOOK for an individual user.

Your NOOK supports up to six NOOK profiles, enabling different people to use your NOOK in different ways.

All the purchases made on your NOOK through any profile are processed through the NOOK or BN.com account to which your NOOK is registered.

Types of Profiles

Your NOOK supports three types of NOOK Profiles:

Primary Profile: This is the profile created by default when
you register your NOOK. This profile can view all the
content on the device an. It can also create and edit
profiles for other users and manage those profiles' access
to content. All purchases made on the NOOK are processed
using the payment method associated with this profile.

- Adult Profile: An adult profile can purchase any type of content. An adult profile can also control which content is visible to itself and which content is visible to any child profile. It can also set parental controls for child profiles. It cannot control which content is visible to the primary profile.
- Child Profile: By default, a child profile can only view and purchase content authorized by the primary profile or through parental controls configured by an adult profile. A child profile does not have the ability to create or edit other profiles. It cannot override parental controls.

Parental Controls

Simple-to-use parental controls help create a "kid-safe" experience on your NOOK. Using parental controls, you can limit the types of content that child profiles can view and purchase. You set up parental controls when you create a child profile. You can adjust them later if you like by editing the child profile.

Tip: You can access controls for profiles at any time by touching in the NOOK Shop or Library.

Using parental controls, you can control whether or not a specific child profile can:

- . Browse the NOOK Shop
- Purchase from NOOK Shop only when using your NOOK account password
- Shop only for kids' content in the NOOK Shop
- · Access Reads for kids
- Access Video for kids
- Access Apps for kids
- · Access Games for kids

In addition, you can select the TV and movie ratings the child profile is allowed to access. Choices include:

- G
- PG
- PG 13
- TV Y
- TV Y7
- TV G
- TV 14

Note: NOOK parental controls do not control non-NOOK apps, such as apps in the Google Play store.

To view the parental controls for a child profile:

- 1. While logged in as the primary profile, touch the Library or Shop to display a list of profiles.
- 2. Touch Parental Controls.

Setting up a New or Existing Profile

Your Samsung Galaxy Tab 4 NOOK will recognize any profiles you created in your Barnes & Noble or NOOK account on a NOOK HD or NOOK HD+. For users to log in with these profiles on the Samsung Galaxy Tab 4 NOOK, their profiles will need to be set up.

Note: To set up an adult User profile, make sure the adult is available to take your NOOK, agree to the Samsung EULA, and set up their account.

- Open the Settings app.
- 2. Touch the General tab → Users.
- Touch the Add User icon (a silhouette with a plus sign) that appears at the top of the screen, below the "General" tab name.
- Select the type of profile, and then follow the prompts to create the profile.

Deleting a Profile

- 1. While logged in as the primary profile, touch the Library or Shop to display a list of profiles.
- Touch Delete Profile, and then touch Delete to confirm the removal.

Note: Deleting a user's NOOK profile does NOT remove the user account from the device. The lock screen will continue to display the user's icon, and the user account can be used for other apps. However, if the user wants to access NOOK apps or content, he or she will have to sign in and set up a NOOK profile.

Managing Content for a Profile

The same content can be shared by multiple profiles, but each profile will need to download the content independently. For example, if the Primary Profile owns a particular NOOK Book and grants another profile access to it, the book will appear in the other profile's Library with a download icon, indicating that the book is available for download. To read the book, the other profile simply has to download it.

Annotations, such as notes and highlights, made in a book do not appear in other profiles' copies of the same book. Similarly, if two profiles own the same book, their reading positions in the book remain independent. If one profile reads to page 17 and the other profile reads to page 25, each profile will be taken to their most recently read page when the book is reopened, regardless of how far the other profile has read.

Alternately, a user can 'assign' a certain content to the child by opening the Details page for a content item (press and hold on the item's cover and select View Details) or by assigning them item to a profile (press and hold on the item's cover and select Assign to Profiles).

- 1. In the Library or Shop, touch to display a list of profiles, and then select an option:
 - To manage your own profile's content, touch Manage your own content.
 - To manage another profile's content, touch Manage Content next to the profile's name.
- Select the content that you want to make available for this profile, and then touch Save.

Managing Parental Controls for a Child Profile

- 1. In the Library or Shop, touch to display a list of profiles.
- Touch Parental Controls next to the profile you want to manage.
- Use checkboxes to select the apps and content the profile should have access to, and then touch **Done**.
- 4. Reboot your NOOK for the changes to take effect.

NOOK Settings

NOOK Settings provide access to the configuration settings for NOOK Library, NOOK Shop (e.g., credit cards and gift cards), and other NOOK features.

View NOOK Account Information

In NOOK Settings, touch My account to see:

- . The name identified as the owner of this NOOK
- The email address associated with the owner's Barnes & Noble or NOOK account
- . The Profile name associated with the owner
- The version number of the NOOK software currently installed
- The model number of this device

Configuring the NOOK Library Widget

You can select the type of content displayed by the NOOK Library widget on the Home screen.

- Open NOOK Settings and touch NOOK Library widget.
- 2. Tap items to control the type of content to be displayed.
 - By default, the widget displays just one issue or episode of any given magazine, TV show, newspaper, or catalog. To change this setting, tap the slider next to the type of content you want to control, and then make a selection.
 - You can choose to hide content. Touch Hide selected content item, and then configure options:
 - Touch content to hide it:
 - To hide an entire category, such as Books, touch the checkbox for that category.
 - To hide a specific item, touch the up arrow by the content's category to display a list of content items, then touch the checkbox for each item you want to hide.

Managing Credit Cards, Gift Cards, and Shop Controls

To add or change the credit card associated with your Barnes & Noble or NOOK account:

- Open NOOK Settings and touch Manage credit cards, gift cards & shop controls.
- 2. Touch Manage credit card.
- If you already have a credit card associated with your account, touch the Change button. Otherwise, touch Add.
- Enter the information for the card you want to associate with your account, and then touch Submit.

To add a gift card to your account:

- Open NOOK Settings and touch Manage credit cards, gift cards & shop controls.
- 2. Touch Manage gift card → Add Gift Card.
- Enter the Card or Certificate Number and the PIN, and then touch Submit.

To redeem an access code for NOOK content:

- Open NOOK Settings and touch Manage credit cards, gift cards & shop controls.
- Touch Redeem code, and then enter the 13-digit access code and touch Add Now.

To clear the NOOK Search history of recent searches:

- Open NOOK Settings and touch Manage credit cards, gift cards & shop controls.
- Touch Clear recent shop searches, and then follow the prompts to confirm the action.

To clear your browsing history from the NOOK Shop:

- Open NOOK Settings and touch Manage credit cards, gift cards & shop controls.
- 2. Touch Clear browsing history, and then follow the prompts to confirm the action.

Linking to Social Media Accounts

You can link your NOOK to your Facebook and Twitter accounts.

- In NOOK Settings, touch Link to social networking.
- Touch Link Your Account button for the network to which you want to link, and then enter your login credentials for your account on that network.

Configuring Adobe DRM Settings

DRM stands for Digital Rights Management, a system for managing publication and distribution rights for digital content. To gain authorized access to content protected with Adobe DRM on your NOOK, you need to obtain a free Adobe ID from Adobe and to enter that ID on your NOOK.

To enter your Adobe ID on your NOOK:

- **1.** Open NOOK Settings, and touch **Books**.
- Touch Adobe DRM Settings → Add Adobe ID, and then enter the email address and password for your Adobe ID.
- 3. Touch OK.

NOOK Search

The NOOK Search app lets you quickly search your Library and the NOOK Shop.

The NOOK Search app appears by default on your Home screen. Touch the app to open it.

To Search, type in the search field at the top of the screen. As you type, your NOOK displays suggestions for matching words and phrases. When you see a word or phrase you are searching for, touch it. If the word or phrase has a shopping bag next to it, tapping the selection searches for the word or phrase in the NOOK Store.

Dictionaries

Your NOOK includes Merriam-Webster's Collegiate®, Eleventh Edition. You can download and install free foreignlanguage dictionaries as well. Only one dictionary can be active at a time.

To download a foreign language dictionary:

- 1. Make sure your NOOK is connected to a Wi-Fi network.
- Open NOOK Settings and touch either Books or Newspapers.

3. In the list of dictionaries, touch the cloud icon or the Download link for the dictionary you want. Once the dictionary is downloaded, it becomes the active dictionary. To make a different dictionary active, tap the radio button by its name.

To remove a dictionary:

- Open NOOK Settings and touch either Books or Newspapers.
- 2. Tap **Remove** under the dictionary name.

NOOK Legal Information

You can read the NOOK Device Terms of Service, the NOOK Store Terms of Service, and the NOOK Privacy Policy from your device.\

Open NOOK Settings and touch Legal Information.

Section 5: Messaging

This section describes how to send and receive messages and other features associated with messaging.

Types of Messages

Your device supports these types of messages:

- Gmail
- Email
- Hangouts
- Google+

Note: Your Wi-Fi-only device does NOT support voice calling and messaging services. Please disregard any "dial" and "message" related menus because some Gmail options are identically set in all Android devices.

Gmail

Send and receive email with Gmail, Google's web-based email service.

■ From a Home screen, touch → M Gmail.

Setting Up Your Gmail Account

If you did not set up a Google Account during the initial configuration, the first time you launch Gmail, your device prompts you to set up your Google Account.

- 1. Touch MG Gmail.
- Follow the prompts to sign in or create a new account. The device communicates with the Google server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your Gmail displays in the Inbox.

Note: You can use more than one Google Account on your device. From a Home screen, touch ♣ ♣ → Settings → General tab → Accounts → Add account to add an additional Google Account.

Composing and Sending Gmail

- 1. Touch MG Gmail.
- Touch ___ Compose, then touch fields to compose
 the message. While composing a message, touch
 Menu for options.
- 3. Touch > SEND to send this message.

- or -

Touch **# Menu** → Save draft to save a draft of this message.

Refreshing Your Gmail Account

Refresh your account to update your device from the Gmail servers.

- 1. Touch MG Gmail.
- While viewing your Inbox, drag your finger downward across your messages.

Gmail Settings

Use the Gmail Settings to configure your Gmail preferences.

- 1. Touch MG Gmail.
- 2. Touch Menu → Settings for settings.

Email

Use Email to view and manage all your email accounts in one application.

■ From a Home screen, touch → **(o)** Email.

Configuring Email Accounts

You can configure Email for most accounts in just a few steps.

- 1. Touch @ Email.
- The first time you set up an email account, at the Set up email screen, enter an Email address and Password, then touch Next.

- or -

For additional accounts, touch **▮ Menu → Settings →**Add account.

Follow the onscreen instructions to set up your email account.

The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email appears in the Inbox for the account

Note: To configure email account settings at any time, use

■ Menu → Settings. Touch the account to display
Account settings.

Composing and Sending Email

- 1. Touch **@ Email**.
- 2. If you have multiple accounts set up, choose an account from the menu at the top of the screen.
- Touch Compose, then touch fields to enter recipients and the email text.
- 4. While composing a message:
 - Touch **# Menu** to display options: Schedule sending, Priority, Tracking options, and Security options.
 - Touch Attach to add a file to the message.
 Available options depend on the type of email account.
- Touch the body of the email to enter the text of your email. Touch the text option buttons to edit and format your message text.

- **6.** Touch **Send** to send the message.
 - or −
 Touch Save to save the email to the Drafts folder.
 - or -

Touch X Discard to discard the email.

Managing Your Email Accounts

If you add more than one email account, you can view email you receive for all accounts in the **Combined view** screen or you can view email accounts individually.

- 1. Touch **@ Email**.
- 2. Touch the drop-down menu at the top left of the screen to select:
 - Combined view: View all email in a combined inbox.
 - <Account Name>: View email for the account.

Refreshing Your Email Account

Refresh your account to update your device from your email servers.

- 1. Touch **@ Email**.
- 2. In the Application Bar, touch C Refresh.

Deleting Email Accounts

To delete an Email account:

- 1. Touch @ Email.
- 2. Touch Menu → Settings → Delete account.

Email Settings

Use the Email Settings to configure your Email preferences.

Note: Available settings depend on the email provider.

- 1. Touch @ Email.
- - Display: Set how email is shown in the email list and when you open them.
 - Composing and sending: Set what functions are available while composing and sending email.
 - Auto advance: Set the screen to show after deleting a message. Choices are: Next email, Previous email, or Email list.
 - **Confirm deletions**: Ask for confirmation before deleting email.

- Priority senders: Enter email addresses that you want treated as a priority.
- Spam addresses: Manage your spam address list.
- Rules for filtering: Create rules for filtering email based on names, address, or subject.
- Touch an account to configure specific settings for that account.

Hangouts

Google Hangouts is an online place to meet friends and family, share photos, and host video calls. Conversation logs are automatically saved to a Chats area in your Gmail account.

Google+

Google+ makes messaging and sharing with your friends a lot easier. You can set up Circles of friends, visit the Stream to get updates from your Circles, or use Instant Upload to automatically upload videos and photos to your own private album on Google+.

■ From a Home screen, touch → St Google+.

Section 6: Multimedia

This section explains how to use the music features of your device including Google Play Music and Music Player. WatchON is also described.

Listening to Music

You can listen to music using your device's built-in speakers, through a wired headset, or through a Bluetooth headset.

For more information, refer to "Bluetooth" on page 86.

Press the **Volume Key** on the side of the device to activate onscreen volume control, then touch and drag on the scale to set the volume. You can also press the **Volume Key** to adjust playback volume.

Play Music

Note: Some options require a Google Account.

Google Play Music is a Google service that gives you instant access to your personal music collection stored on the Internet and your device. Google Play Music lets you browse, shop, and play back songs purchased from the Google Play Store app, as well as songs you have loaded from your own music library

For more information, visit music.google.com.

■ From a Home screen, touch → Play Music.

Music Player

Use the Music application to listen to music.

To access Music Player:

■ From a Home screen, touch \rightarrow \bigcirc Music.

Note: Some file formats are not supported depending on the software installed on the device. Some files may not play properly depending on the encoding method used.

Playing Music

Select a music category, and then select a song to play.

Touch the album image at the bottom of the screen to open the music player screen.

The following Music controls are available:



Streams the current music file to another device via Samsung Link.



Volume control and SoundAlive.



Volume control showing volume muted.



Assign the current song as a Favorite.



Lists the current playlist songs.



Touch and hold to rewind the song. Touch to go to previous song.



Pause the song.



Start the song after pausing.



Touch and hold to fast-forward the song. Touch to go to next song.



Shuffles the current list of songs randomly.



Songs play in order and are not shuffled.



Plays the entire song list once.



Replays the current list when the list ends.



Repeats the currently playing song.

To listen to songs at equal volume levels:

■ Touch Menu → Settings → Player → Smart volume.

Caution! When Smart volume is activated, the volume may end up louder than the device volume level. Use caution to avoid long-term exposure to loud sounds to prevent damage to your hearing.

Note: Smart Volume may not be activated for some files.

To set a personalized sound while listening to songs with a headset:

When you turn the volume up to level 14 or higher, the adapt sound option is not applied to music playback. If you turn the volume down to level 13 or lower, the option is reapplied.

Setting a Song as an Alarm Ringtone

To use the currently-playing song as an alarm ringtone:

■ Touch Menu → Set as alarm tone.

Creating Playlists

To create a playlist of songs.

- 1. Touch the Playlists tab.
- 2. Touch Menu → Create playlist.
- 3. Enter a title and touch OK.
- Touch Add tracks, select songs to include, and then touch Done.

To add the currently-playing song to a playlist:

■ Touch Menu → Add to playlist.

Playing Music by Mood

Play music grouped by mood. The playlist is automatically created by the device.

- Touch Menu → Music square and select a cell of mood.
 - or -

Select multiple cells by dragging your finger across multiple cells.

WatchON

Enjoy all of your favorite movies and TV shows with WatchON.

Important! Before you use WatchON, verify that you have an active Internet connection available. For more information, refer to "Wi-Fi" on page 83.

Notes

- Before beginning your initial WatchON application setup, make sure that your TV is turned off.
- Sign into your Samsung account before using WatchON. For more information, refer to "Your Samsung Account" on page 35.

Initial Configuration

- Touch Set up WatchON.The Privacy policy displays.
- Read the Privacy policy, check the I have read and accept the terms of the above privacy policy box, and touch Next.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions.

- 2. Touch Menu for the following options.
 - Sign in: Sign in to your Samsung account to improve your WatchON experience.
 - **Settings**: Configure Samsung WatchON settings. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Section 7: Camera and Video

Camera

Use this application to take photos or videos.

Use **Gallery** to view photos and videos taken with the device's camera.

■ From a Home screen, touch \rightarrow \bigcirc Camera.

Note: The camera automatically shuts off when unused.


Note: Make sure that the lens is clean. Otherwise, the device may not work properly in some modes that require high resolutions.

Camera Etiquette

- Do not take photos or videos of other people without their permission.
- Do not take photos or videos where legally prohibited.
- Do not take photos or videos in places where you may violate other people's privacy.

Taking Photos

- Touch the image on the preview screen where the camera should focus.
 - When the subject is in focus, the focus frame turns green.
- 2. Touch on to take the photo.



Shooting Mode

Several photo effects are available. Some modes are not available when taking self-portraits.

- Touch MODE, and then scroll up or down the screen at the right side of the screen.
 - Auto: Use this to allow the camera to evaluate the surroundings and determine the ideal mode for the photo.
 - Beauty face: Take a photo with lightened faces for gentler images.
 - Touch a to take multiple photos. To get the best shot, hold the camera steady and remain still while taking photos. When Gallery opens, touch the yellow frame on each face, and choose the best individual pose for the subject. After choosing a pose for each individual, touch Save to merge the images into a single photo, and save it.

- **Sound & shot**: Use this to take a photo with sound.
 - Touch a to take a photo. The device records a few seconds of audio after taking a photo.

Note: While taking photos in this mode, sound is recorded by the internal microphone.

 Panorama: Take a photo composed of many photos strung together.

To get the best shot, follow these tips:

- Move the camera slowly in one direction.
- Keep the camera's viewfinder within the guide frame.
- Avoid taking photos of a subject in front of unrecognizable backgrounds, such as empty skies or plain walls.
- **Sports**: Use this setting for fast-moving subjects.
- Night: Take brighter, clearer pictures in low light without a flash.

Panoramic Photos

A panoramic photo is a wide landscape image consisting of multiple shots.

- 1. Touch MODE → Panorama.
- 2. Touch and move the camera in one direction. When the blue frame aligns with the viewfinder, the camera automatically takes another shot in a panoramic sequence. To stop shooting, touch . If the viewfinder is out of the direction, the device stops shooting.

Applying Filter Effects

Use the filter effects to take unique photos or videos.

Touch and select a filter effect. The available options vary by mode.

Recording Videos

- To record a video, touch the Camera / Record Video switch → and swipe downward.
 - To start or continue recording, touch .
- To pause recording, touch (II).
- To stop recording, touch 🕕.

Recording Mode

- Touch > Options → Recording mode to change the recording mode.
 - Normal: Use this mode for normal quality.
 - Limit for email: Use this mode to lower quality for sending via messages.

Zooming In and Out

Use one of the following methods:

- Use the **Volume** button to zoom in or out.
- Spread two fingers apart on the screen to zoom in, and pinch to zoom out.

Note: The zoom in and out effect is available when using the zoom feature while shooting video.

Share Shot

- Touch > Options → OFF and select one of the following:
 - Share shot: Send a photo directly to another device via Wi-Fi Direct.
 - Buddy photo share: Set the device to recognize a person's face that you have tagged in a photo and send it to that person.
 - Remote viewfinder: Set a device to control the camera remotely.

Controlling the Camera Remotely

Set a device as a viewfinder to control the camera remotely.

Touch > Options → → Remote viewfinder, and then connect the device and the camera using Wi-Fi Direct. Touch to take a photo remotely using the device as a viewfinder.

Configuring Settings for Camera

■ Touch to configure settings for Camera. Not all of the following options are available in both still camera and video camera modes. The available options vary depending on the mode used.

Camera:

- Photo size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution photos take up more memory.
- Metering: Select a metering method. This determines how light values are calculated. Center-weighted measures background light in the center of the scene. Matrix averages the entire scene. Spot measures the light value at a specific location.

Video recorder:

 Video size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution videos take up more memory.

Settings:

• Location tag: Attach a GPS location tag to the photo.

Note: To improve GPS signals, avoid shooting in locations where the signal may be obstructed, such as between buildings or in low-lying areas, or in poor weather conditions.

Tip: Your location may appear on your photos when you upload them to the Internet. To avoid this, deactivate the GPS tag setting.

- **Review**: Set to show photos or videos after taking them.
- **Volume key**: Set the device to use the Volume button to control the shutter or zoom function.
- Timer: Use this for delayed-time shots.

- White balance: Select an appropriate white balance, so images have a true-to-life color range. The settings are designed for specific lighting situations. These settings are similar to the heat range for white-balance exposure in professional cameras.
- Brightness: Change the exposure value. This determines how much light the camera's sensor receives. For low light situations, use a higher exposure.
- **Guidelines**: Display viewfinder guides to help composition when selecting subjects.
- Voice control: Set the camera to take photos with voice commands.
- Contextual filename: Set the camera to display contextual tags. Activate this to use Tag Buddy in Gallery and Story Album.
- Save as flipped: Invert the image to create a mirrorimage of the original scene.
- **Storage**: Select the memory location for storage.
- Reset: Reset the camera settings.
- **Help**: Access help information for using the camera.

Shortcuts

Reorganize shortcuts for easy access to the camera's various options.

- Touch > Options.
- 2. Touch and hold a shortcut icon to display all shortcuts.
- 3. Touch and hold an option and drag it to a slot at the top of the screen.

Note: The other icons can be moved within the list by touching and dragging them.

Tip: Touch **Reset** to reset the quick settings layout to the default settings.

Gallery

Use this application to view images and videos.

From a Home screen, touch → From a Home screen, touch → From a Home screen.

Note: Some file formats are not supported depending on the software installed on the device. Some files may not play properly depending on the encoding method used.

Viewing Images

Launching Gallery displays available folders. When another application, such as Email, saves an image, the Download folder is automatically created to contain the image.

Likewise, capturing a screenshot automatically creates the Screenshots folder. Select a folder to open it.

In a folder, images are displayed by creation date. Select an image to view it in full screen.

Scroll left or right to view the next or previous image.

Zooming In and Out

Use one of the following methods to zoom in or out on an image:

- Double-tap anywhere on the screen to zoom in or zoom out.
- Spread two fingers apart on any place to zoom in.
 Pinch the screen to zoom out.

Playing Videos

Video files show the (>) icon on their thumbnails.

■ Select a video to watch it and touch (►).

Trimming Segments of a Video

- Select a video, and then touch X Trim.
- Move the start bracket to the desired starting point, move the end bracket to the desired ending point, and then save the video.

Image Options

- While viewing an image, touch Menu and use the following functions:
 - Favorite: Add to the favorites list.
 - Slideshow: Start a slideshow with the images in the current folder.
 - Photo frame: Use this to add a frame and a note to an image. The edited image is saved in the Photo frame folder.
 - **Photo note**: Use this to write a note on the back of the image. Touch _____, to edit the note.
 - Copy to clipboard: Copy to clipboard.
 - **Print**: Print the image via a USB or Wi-Fi connection. Some printers may not be compatible with the device.
 - Rename: Rename the file.

- Buddy photo share: Send the image to a person whose face is tagged in the image.
- Rotate left: Rotate counter-clockwise.
- Rotate right: Rotate clockwise.
- **Crop**: Resize the blue frame to crop and save the image in it.
- Set as: Set the image as wallpaper or a contact image.
- Details: View image details.
- Settings: Change the Gallery settings.

Favorite Images

Sharing Images

Use one of the following methods:

- In a folder, touch Menu → Select item, select images by ticking, and then touch to send them to others or share them via social network services.
- When viewing an image, touch to send it to others or share it via social network services.

Setting as Wallpaper

■ When viewing an image, touch Menu → Set as to set the image as wallpaper or to assign it to a contact.

Tagging Faces

- Touch Menu → Settings → Tags → Face tag.
 A yellow frame appears around the recognized face.
- Touch the face, touch Add name, and then select or add a contact
- When the face tag appears on an image, touch the face tag and use available options, such as sending messages.

Note: Face recognition may fail depending on the face angle, face size, skin color, facial expression, light conditions, or accessories the subject is wearing.

Using Tag Buddy

To display a contextual tag (weather, location, date, and person's name) when opening an image:

- 1. Touch Menu → Settings → Tags → Tag buddy.
- Touch the OFF/ON button to turn Tag buddy ON .

Deleting Images

Use one of the following methods:

- In a folder, touch Menu → Select item, select images by ticking, and then touch Delete.
- When viewing an image, touch **Delete**.

Video


Use this application to play video files.

■ From a Home screen, touch → Video.



 Touch and hold to move forwards quickly.

Deleting Videos

■ Touch Menu → Delete, select videos by ticking, and then touch Delete.

Sharing Videos

Touch $\mbox{$\frac{1}{8}$ Menu} \rightarrow$ Share via, select videos by ticking, touch **Done**, and then select a sharing method.

Using Popup Video Player

Use this feature to use other applications without closing the video player.

- While watching videos, touch □ to use the pop-up player.
- Spread two fingers apart on the screen to enlarge the player or pinch to reduce it.
- To move the player, drag the player to another location.

Section 8: Connections

Your device includes features to connect to the internet and to other devices via Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, or a USB cable.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides access to local area networks.

Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing Wi-Fi network. Wi-Fi networks can be Open (unsecured), or Secured (requiring you to provide login credentials).

Your device supports Wi-Fi 802.11 a/b/g/n.

Turn Wi-Fi On or Off

Turn your device's Wi-Fi service on or off. When you turn Wi-Fi service on, your device automatically searches for available, in-range WAPs (Wireless Access Points).

From the Notification Panel

- From any screen, touch the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification Panel displays.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi ON (green) or OFF (grey).

From Settings

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Wi-Fi ON **OFF** Or OFF

Scan and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

When you turn on Wi-Fi, your device searches for available Wi-Fi connections and displays them.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch the OFF/ON button to turn Wi-Fi ON
- When your device completes a scan, touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the Wi-Fi network is open, you will be automatically connected. If the Wi-Fi network is secured, enter the password at the prompt to connect.

Note: To begin a new scan for available WAPs, touch **Scan**.

Add a Wi-Fi Network Manually

- 1. From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Wi-Fi.
- Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Wi-Fi ON



- Touch Add Wi-Fi Network (below the available networks), then enter these fields:
 - Network SSID: Enter the name of the Wi-Fi network.
 - Security: Select the type of security used by the Wi-Fi network.
 - Enter password: If the network is secured, enter the password. Touch **Show password** to display it.
 - **Show advanced options**: Select the Proxy settings and IP settings for the network.
- 4. Touch **Connect** to save the settings and connect to the network.

Wi-Fi Status Indicators

The following icons show your current Wi-Fi connection status at a glance:



Displays when Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Displays when there is a Wi-Fi network is available but you are not connected to it. It may also display if there is a communication issue with the Wireless Access Point (WAP).

Advanced Settings

Set up and manage wireless access points.

- 1. From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch the OFF/ON button to turn Wi-Fi ON



- Touch Menu for options:
 - Advanced:
 - Network notification: Send a notification when an open network is available.
 - Sort by: Sort Wi-Fi networks by alphabet or RSSI (received signal strength indicato).

- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to switch from Wi-Fi to mobile data for data communications when the device goes to sleep (when the backlight goes out).
- Always allow scanning: Allow Google location service and other apps to scan for networks, even when Wi-Fi is turned off.
- Wi-Fi timer: Set the start and end time to connect to or disconnect from Wi-Fi networks.
- Install certificates: Install certificates from a memory card.
- MAC address: View your device's MAC address (not configurable).
- IP address: View your device's IP address (not configurable).
- WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
- WPN PIN entry: View the PIN used by your device to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment (not configurable).
- Help: Learn about setting up and using Wi-Fi networks.

Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows devices to connect to each other directly via Wi-Fi, without a Wi-Fi network or hotspot, and without having to set up the connection.

Important! All devices must be Wi-Fi Direct-enabled.

Turn Wi-Fi Direct On

- 2. Touch the OFF/ON button to turn Wi-Fi ON (Wi-Fi must be enabled to use Wi-Fi Direct.)
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi Direct to turn Wi-Fi Direct on.

Turn Wi-Fi Direct Off

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch Wi-Fi Direct to view connections.
- **3.** Touch **End connection** to turn Wi-Fi Direct off and terminate all Wi-Fi Direct connections

Note: Turning Wi-Fi off also turns off Wi-Fi Direct and terminates all Wi-Fi Direct connections

Connect to Wi-Fi Direct Devices

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings →
 Connections tab → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Wi-Fi ON (Wi-Fi must be enabled to use Wi-Fi Direct.)
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi Direct to turn Wi-Fi Direct on.
- **4.** Enable Wi-Fi Direct on the target device. Consult the target device's documentation for more information.
- On your device, touch Wi-Fi Direct to scan for the other device.
- In the scanned list, touch the target device to connect with it, or touch Multi-connect to connect to multiple devices (not all devices support multi-connect).
- Follow the prompts on both devices to complete the connection.

Note: Once connected, the target device will show as Connected in your list of Wi-Fi Direct devices and the icon will display on the Status Bar.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology for exchanging information over a distance of about 30 feet. If the devices are in range, you can exchange information between them, even if they are in different rooms.

Your device can use Bluetooth to share photos, contacts and other content with other Bluetooth devices. Many of the apps on your device provide options for sharing via Bluetooth under **Menu**.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth-compatible devices.

Turn Bluetooth On or Off

From the Notification Panel

- From any screen, touch the top of the screen and swipe downward. The Notification Panel displays.
- Touch Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth ON (green) or OFF (grey).

From Settings

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Bluetooth ON or OFF

Note: The

icon displays on the Status bar when Bluetooth is active.

Pair with a Bluetooth Device

Pairing initiates a connection between your device and the target device, usually by using a passcode or PIN. After pairing, your device and the target device recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Bluetooth ON
- Make sure that the target device is discoverable, so that your device can find it. Refer to the target device's documentation for more information.
- **4.** Touch **Scan**. Your device will start to scan for Bluetooth devices within range.
- 5. From the list of scanned devices, touch the target device and follow the prompts to complete the pairing:
 - If the target device requires a PIN, enter a PIN for the target device and touch OK. When prompted, enter the PIN on the target device.
 - If the device allows automatic or smart pairing, your device will attempt to pair with the device automatically.
 Follow the prompts on your device and the target device to complete the pairing.

Note: Once paired, the target device will be listed under Paired Devices.

Reconnect to a Bluetooth Device

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → Connections tab → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch the OFF/ON button to turn Bluetooth ON
- 3. Make sure that the target device is discoverable.
- Touch the target device's name in the Bluetooth devices section.
- If prompted to enter a passcode, try 0000 or 1234, or consult the target device's documentation.

Disconnect or Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

Disconnect from a Bluetooth Device

You can disconnect your device from a Bluetooth device, such as a headset. Disconnecting does not unpair the Bluetooth device—the next time you connect, your device and the target device will recognize each other and exchange information without having to enter a passcode or PIN.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → Connections tab → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Bluetooth ON
- Touch the connected device, and then touch **OK** to disconnect

Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

You can make your device forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the other device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passcode again.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → Connections tab → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn Bluetooth ON
- 3. Under *Paired devices*, touch the next to the device, and then tap **Unpair**.

Bluetooth Settings

When Bluetooth is on, additional settings are available.

- From a Home screen, touch → **(a)** Settings → Connections tab → Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch the OFF/ON button to turn Bluetooth ON
- Touch your device's name to enable or disable visibility to other Bluetooth devices. When your device is visible, other devices can find your device during a scan. Your device remains visible for the period of time set in the Visibility timeout setting.

- 4. Touch the beside a paired device for options:
 - Rename: Enter a new name for the paired device.
 - Unpair: Delete the Bluetooth connection to this device.
 To connect to the other device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passcode again.
- **5.** Touch Menu for options:
 - **Visibility timeout**: Set the length of time your device is visible to other devices when you turn on visibility.
 - Received files: View files transferred to your device.
 - Rename device: Change the name of your device.
 - Help: Learn about Bluetooth, and other settings.

Connect to a Computer

Connect your device to a computer to transfer data between your device and the computer. Use the USB cable that comes with your device, or use one of the pre-loaded apps on your device to connect wirelessly.

Transfer Data

Connect your device to a computer, via USB cable, to transfer data as a Media device using MTP (Media Transfer Protocol), or as a Camera using PTP (Photo Transfer Protocol).

- Attach your device to the computer with a USB data cable. Your device recognizes the connection as the last connection method you used, and displays a connection alert in the Status bar and Notifications.
- **2.** From the Home screen, sweep your finger downward to display Notifications, then touch the alert.
- 3. Select a connection method:
 - Media device (MTP): Transfer media files with Windows, or using Android file transfer on a Mac (see android.com/filetransfer).
 - Camera (PTP): Transfer photos using camera software, and transfer files to computers that do not support MTP.
- On your computer, choose a method for accessing your device. Available options depend on the programs installed on your computer.
- Transfer files to the memory card. When finished, you can disconnect the USB cable.

Section 9: Applications

This section contains a description of each application that is available on the Apps screen, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that description is provided.

Updating Applications

Once you have registered your device (see "Software Update" on page 137) and signed into your Google Account (see "Your Google Account" on page 35), you may see the Updates Available notification in the Status Bar if there is a new version of one or more apps available or, when you open an application that is preloaded on your device, an

To update the applications:

1. Touch the top of the screen and swipe downward.

Update Available message may be displayed.

Touch Updates available.

Accessing Applications

The **Apps** screen displays all applications installed on your wireless device. Applications that you download and install from Google Play or from the web are also added to a Home screen.

To access applications:

- 1. From a Home screen, touch The Apps screen displays.
- Locate the application's icon and touch it to launch the application.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequentlyused applications to one of the Home screens, if it is not there by default. For more information, refer to "Adding a Shortcut or Widget" on page 28.

Alarm

Set alarms for reminders or for wake-up times.

- 1. Touch Alarm.
- 2. Touch **Turn alarm on** to activate the alarm. A gray alarm means the alarm is deactivated.
- 3. Touch an alarm to change any of its settings and then touch **Save** to save the updates.

Note: When an alarm is set, odisplays in the Status Bar.

Setting Alarms

- Touch Create, set a time for the alarm to go off, select days for the alarm to repeat, and then touch Save.
 - Location alarm: Set a location. The alarm goes off only when you are in the location.
 - **Snooze**: Set an interval and the number of times for the alarm to repeat after the preset time.
 - **Smart alarm**: Set a time for the alarm to go off before the preset time.

Stopping Alarms

- Drag outside the large circle to stop an alarm.
- Drag outside the large circle to repeat the alarm after a specified length of time.

Deleting Alarms

■ Touch and hold the alarm, and then touch **Touch** Delete.

Calculator

The Calculator provides basic and advanced arithmetic functions.

- 1. Touch 👯 Calculator.
- 2. Enter the first number using the numeric keys.
- Enter the operation for your calculation by touching the corresponding onscreen arithmetic function key.
- 4. Enter the next number.
- 5. To view the result, touch the = (equals) key.
- 6. Repeat Steps 3 through 5 as many times as required.

To clear the result:

■ Touch C

To clear the calculator history:

■ Touch Menu → Clear history.

For more advanced problems, use the advanced operators **sin**, **In**, **cos**, **log**, **tan**, and so on, just as you would on a pocket calculator.

To copy or cut the contents of the display:

Touch and hold entries in the Calculator's display field.
 Copied to clipboard displays. Paste the copied value in another app.

Calendar

Use this application to manage events and tasks.

■ Touch 31 Calendar.

Creating Events or Tasks

- 1. Touch + and use one of the following methods:
 - Event: Enter an event with an optional repeat setting.
 - Task: Enter a task with an optional priority setting.

- or -

Touch a date on the Calendar to select it and touch it again.

Enter a title and specify which calendar to use or sync with. Then touch **Edit event details** or **Edit task details** to add more details, such as how often the event repeats, alerts, or where it takes place.

Attach a map showing the location of the event. Enter
the location in the Location field, touch a next to the
field, and then pinpoint the precise location by touching
and holding on the map that appears.

Syncing with Google Calendar

- On a Home screen, touch → I Settings → General tab → Accounts → Google.
- Touch a Google Account → Sync Calendar → Sync now.

To manually sync for updating:

If you have signed in to your Samsung Account:

- Touch your Samsung Account to manage your sync settings or remove your Samsung Account.
- Touch Storage usage to show the storage used and the remaining storage available.
- Touch Sync settings to sync your calendar, contacts, Internet, S Note, and Scrapbook settings with your Samsung Account.
- Touch **Backup** to manage your back up and restore options.

- Touch **Restore** to retrieve data from your Samsung account.
- 3. Under Dropbox:

If you have not signed in to you Dropbox account, touch **Link Dropbox account**. For more information, refer to "Dropbox" on page 94.

Backup and Reset

You can also back up your data to the Google server and reset your device to its factory defaults.

Backup and Restore

To enable or disable backup of your information to the Google server.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Backup and reset.
- Touch Back up my data to enable or disable back up of application data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to the Google server.

Once the **Back up my data** option is enabled, then the **Backup account** and the **Automatic restore** options are available.

- Touch Backup account and touch your Google Gmail account or touch Add account to set your Google Gmail account to be backed up to the Google server.
- Touch Automatic restore to enable automatic restoration of settings from the Google server. When enabled, backed-up settings are restored when you reinstall an application.

Factory Data Reset

Use Factory data reset to return your device to its factory defaults. This setting erases all data from the device, including Google or other email account settings, system and application data and settings, and downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files. If you reset the tablet in this way, the next time you turn on your tablet you are prompted to reenter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

- From a Home screen, touch → ♠ Settings →
 General tab → Backup and reset → Factory data
 reset.
- Touch Reset device, then follow the prompts to perform the reset.

Date and Time

By default, your device receives date and time information from the wireless network. When you are outside network coverage, you may want to set date and time information manually using the Date & time settings.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → General tab → Date and time.
- 2. Configure the following settings:
 - Set date: Enter the current date (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - Set time: Enter the current time (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - **Select time zone**: Choose your local time zone (only available when the Automatic setting is disabled).
 - Use 24-hour format: Set the format for time displays.
 - Select date format: Set the format for date displays.

Accessories

To change accessory settings:

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings →
 General tab → Accessories.
 - Dock sound: play a sound when your device is connected to or removed from a desktop dock.
 - Audio output mode: use the dock speaker when your device is connected to a desktop dock.

Application Manager

You can download and install applications from Google Play or create applications using the Android SDK and install them on your device. Use Application manager settings to manage applications.

Warning! Because this device can be configured with system software not provided by or supported by Google or any other company, end-users operate these devices at their own risk.

Memory Usage

See how memory is being used by Downloaded or Running applications.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Application manager.
- Touch DOWNLOADED, SD CARD, or RUNNING to display memory usage for that category of applications.

The graph at the bottom of the DOWNLOADED tab shows used and free device memory. The graph at the bottom of the RUNNING tab shows used and free RAM.

Downloaded

Displays apps you have downloaded onto your device.

- Touch DOWNLOADED to view a list of all the downloaded applications on your device.

- 4. To reset your application preferences, touch **Menu**→ Reset app preferences.
- Touch an application to view and update information about the application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

The following options are displayed:

- Force stop: Stop an app that is misbehaving. Restart your device if stopping an app, process, or service causes your device to stop working correctly.
- **Uninstall**: Delete the application from the tablet.
- Move to SD card: Move this app to your microSD card.
- Clear data: Clear application data from memory.
- Clear cache: If the app stores data in a temporary area
 of the device's memory, and the amount of information
 stored is displayed, touch this button to clearing the
 temporary storage.
- Clear defaults: If you have configured an app to launch certain file types by default, clear that setting.
- Permissions: Lists the kinds of information about your device and data to which the app has access.

Running Services

View and control services running on your device.

- 2. Touch the **RUNNING** tab. All the applications that are currently running on the device display.
- Touch Show cached processes to display all the cached processes that are running. Touch Show services in use to switch back.
- **4.** Touch one of the applications to view application information. The following options display:
 - **Stop**: Stops the application from running on the device. This is usually done prior to uninstalling the application.

Warning! Not all services can be stopped. Stopping services may have undesirable consequences on the application or Android System.

Report: Report failure and other application information.

Note: Options vary by application.

Default Applications

Set and manage your default applications.

- From a Home screen, touch → ♠ Settings →
 General tab → Default applications.
- 2. Touch an app to set it as the default application.

- or -

Touch **Clear** to remove an app as the default application.

Battery

See how much battery power is used for device activities.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Battery.
 - The battery level displays as a percentage. The amount of time the battery has been used also displays.

 Battery usage displays in percentages per application.
- Touch Screen, Android System, or Android OS to view how the display and the Android system are affecting battery use.

Note: Other applications may be running that affect battery use.

Touch Show battery percentage to display the device battery status next to the battery icon.

Power Saving Mode

When enabled, your device automatically analyzes the screen and adjusts the brightness to conserve battery power.

- From a Home screen, touch Settings → Settings → General tab → Power saving mode.
- 2. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn the feature ON
- Turn Power saving on and touch the Power saving mode settings (CPU performance or Screen output) to enable or disable them.
- Touch Learn about power saving to display more information about conserving power.

Storage

View the device memory and usage, or mount, unmount, or format an optional memory card (not included).

Device Memory

■ From a Home screen, touch → ♠ Settings → General tab → Storage. The Device memory displays as Total space, System memory, Used space, Cached data, Miscellaneous files, and Available space.

SD Card

Once a memory card has been installed in your device, the card memory displays as Total space and Available space.

Mounting an SD Card

When you install a memory card, it is automatically mounted (connected to the tablet) and prepared for use. However, should you unmount the card without removing it from the tablet, you will need to mount it before it can be accessed.

- 1. Install an SD card. For more information, refer to "Installing a Memory Card" on page 12.
- 2. From a Home screen, touch → ♦ Settings → General tab → Storage.
- 3. Touch Mount SD card.

Unmounting an SD Card

Important! To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, always unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Storage.
- 2. Touch Unmount SD card.
- At the prompt, select **OK** to safely unmount the memory card.
- 4. Remove the SD card from the slot.

Important! Unmounting an SD card will stop some applications from functioning. Applications may not be available until you remount the SD card.

Removing a Memory Card

Important! To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Storage.
- Under SD card, touch Unmount SD card and then touch OK.
- Open the memory card slot cover and turn to expose the slot.
- Gently press inward on the memory card so that it pops out from the slot, and carefully pull the card out.
- **5.** Close the memory card slot cover.

Formatting an SD Card

When formatting an SD card you will want to backup your music and photo files that are stored on the card because formatting the SD card deletes all the stored data.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Storage.
- Touch Format SD card and then touch Format SD card again on the warning screen.
- 3. Touch Delete all.

Security

Use the Security settings to secure your device.

Encryption

To require a numeric PIN or password to decrypt your tablet each time you power it on or encrypt the data on your SD card each time it is connected:

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → General tab → Security.
- Touch Encrypt device. For more information, read the displayed help screen.
- Touch Encrypt external SD card to enable the encryption on SD card data that requires a password be entered each time the microSD card is connected.

Tip: Make sure your battery is charged more than 80 percent. Encryption takes an hour or more.

Find My Mobile

Use this option to allow your device to be locked and tracked, and for your data to be deleted remotely. You must sign up for a Samsung account and enable Google location service to use Remote controls.

Sign In to Your Samsung Account

- **2.** Touch **Remote controls**. Read the information and touch **OK** to acknowledge the information.
- Touch Add account to create a Samsung account.
 For more information about Samsung accounts, see "Your Samsung Account" on page 35.

Enable or Disable Remote Controls

Once you have signed in to your Samsung Account, you can enable or disable Remote controls.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → General tab → Security → Remote controls.
- Enter your Samsung account password in the pop-up
 Enter password field and touch Done.

Touch **Do not show for 90 days** to temporarily disable this screen.

- Touch **OK**.The Remote controls screen displays.
- 4. Touch the **OFF/ON** button to turn the feature ON
- Touch Use wireless networks to enable location information using the wireless network.

Find My Mobile Web Page

To launch the Find My Mobile web page:

- Select which application to launch the application. Touch Internet or Chrome and select Always or Just once.

The Find My Mobile webpage displays.

Follow onscreen instructions.

Passwords

When enabled, password characters display briefly as you touch them while entering passwords.

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Security.
- **2.** Touch **Make passwords visible** to enable or disable brief displays of password characters.

Device Administration

To add or remove device administrators:

- From a Home screen, touch → Settings → General tab → Security.
- 2. Touch Device administrators.

To enable or disable installation of non-Google Play applications.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → General tab → Security.
- Touch Unknown sources.
- Read the message and touch **OK** to allow installation of non-Google Play applications.

Warning! Enabling this option causes your tablet and personal data to be more vulnerable to attack by applications from unknown sources.

To block or warn before installing apps that may cause harm, touch Verify apps.

Security Update Service

To set security update service settings:

- 2. Touch Security policy updates for these options:
 - Automatic updates: Automatically check for changes to the security policy and download any updates to improve security.
 - Check for updates: Check for updates manually.
- Touch Send security reports to send security reports to Samsung via Wi-Fi for threat analysis.

Credential Storage

If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason you do not trust it, you can disable or remove it.

- From a Home screen, touch Settings → Settings → General tab → Security.
- Touch Storage type to set a storage type for credential contents.
- 3. Touch Trusted credentials.

The trusted credentials screen has two tabs:

- System: Displays CA certificates that are permanently installed in the ROM of your device.
- **User**: Displays any CA certificates that you installed, for example, in the process of installing a client certificate.
- Touch a CA certificate to examine its details.
 A scrolling screen displays the details.

 Scroll to the bottom of the details screen and touch
 Turn off to disable a System certificate.

Caution! When you disable a system CA certificate, the **Turn off** button changes to **Turn on**, so you can enable the certificate again, if necessary.

Touch **OK** to return to the certificate list.

Touch Install from device storage, then choose a certificate and follow the prompts to install encrypted certificates stored on the USB storage.

Note: You must have installed a memory card containing encrypted certificates to use this feature.

Touch Clear credentials to erase the credential contents from the device and reset the password.

Note: This setting only appears if you have installed encrypted certificates.

About Device

View information about your device, including status, legal information, hardware and software versions, and battery use.

- From a Home screen, touch → I Settings → General tab → About device.
- 2. Touch items to view details:
 - Software update: Connect to the network and download new software updates for your device, if available.
 - Status: View Battery status, Battery level, IP address, Wi-Fi MAC address, Bluetooth address, Up time, and Device status.
 - Legal information: Touch an option to display Open source licenses, Google and Samsung legal information, and Privacy Alert.
 - Device name: Enter the name for your device. The default is the model number.
 - Model number: Display your device's model number.
 - Android version: Display the firmware version of your device.

- Kernel version: Display the kernel version of your device.
- Build number: Display your device's build number.
- SE for Android status: Display Security
 Enhancements for Android status information.

Software Update

The Software Update feature enables you to use your device to connect to the network and download any new software directly to your device. The device automatically updates with the latest available software when you access this option.

Software Update Options

To register your device and check for a software update:

- 2. Touch Update now.
 - Your device is connected to the server and a search is performed for a software update.
- 3. Touch Auto update to check for updates automatically.

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
